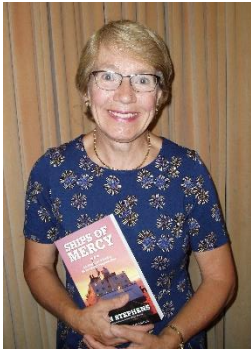

Mercy Ships

(July monthly meeting)

After Peter had welcomed everyone, Margaret Hudson provided the 'warm up' with a brief humorous recitation, which was well received.



The main business was an illustrated talk by Alison Briggs about Mercy Ships. She introduced us to children and then adults from the poorest African countries whose lives had been blighted by severe disfigurements, hard to bear in themselves and harder still because of the severe social consequences. There were some brutal statistics to illustrate the dearth of medical provision, itself virtually inaccessible to those living in remote rural communities. The contrast in life expectancy with the Western world was stark. She showed us how the problems were compounded by the mass migrations of refugees, lack of clean water, poor sanitation and poverty.

This is the context for the work of Mercy Ships, a charity where everyone – not least Gerry Parker, surgeon, now in his twenty-ninth year of volunteering – works for free. In 1978 a visit by ‘Youth for the Mission’ identified the need for ships to go to countries where medical help was desperately needed. It took four years to raise the money for the first ship, *Anastasia*. This had two operating theatres and recovery wards for those who needed them. All the healthcare provided was, and remains, free. Now pensioned off, she was replaced by *African Mercy Ship*, with five theatres, recovery wards, and the only scanner operating in West Africa. Another ship is almost ready. As Alison described to us, Mercy Ships is a most professional organisation with a skilful planning team negotiating the next long-term moorings years in advance, well-organised reception and triage, providing not only life-changing operations but also aftercare, healthcare products and education, and help with agricultural and sanitation projects. Towards the end we saw children and adults whose lives had been transformed by corrective surgery – to eyes, cleft palates, monstrous growths, feet pointing backwards Of course there is not always a magic solution and for the disappointed the volunteers provide palliative care, comfort and prayer. This was far removed from a ‘hard sell’. But what could we do if we wished to help? Pray, volunteer, collect toothbrushes, give aid. A very moving and excellently presented talk.

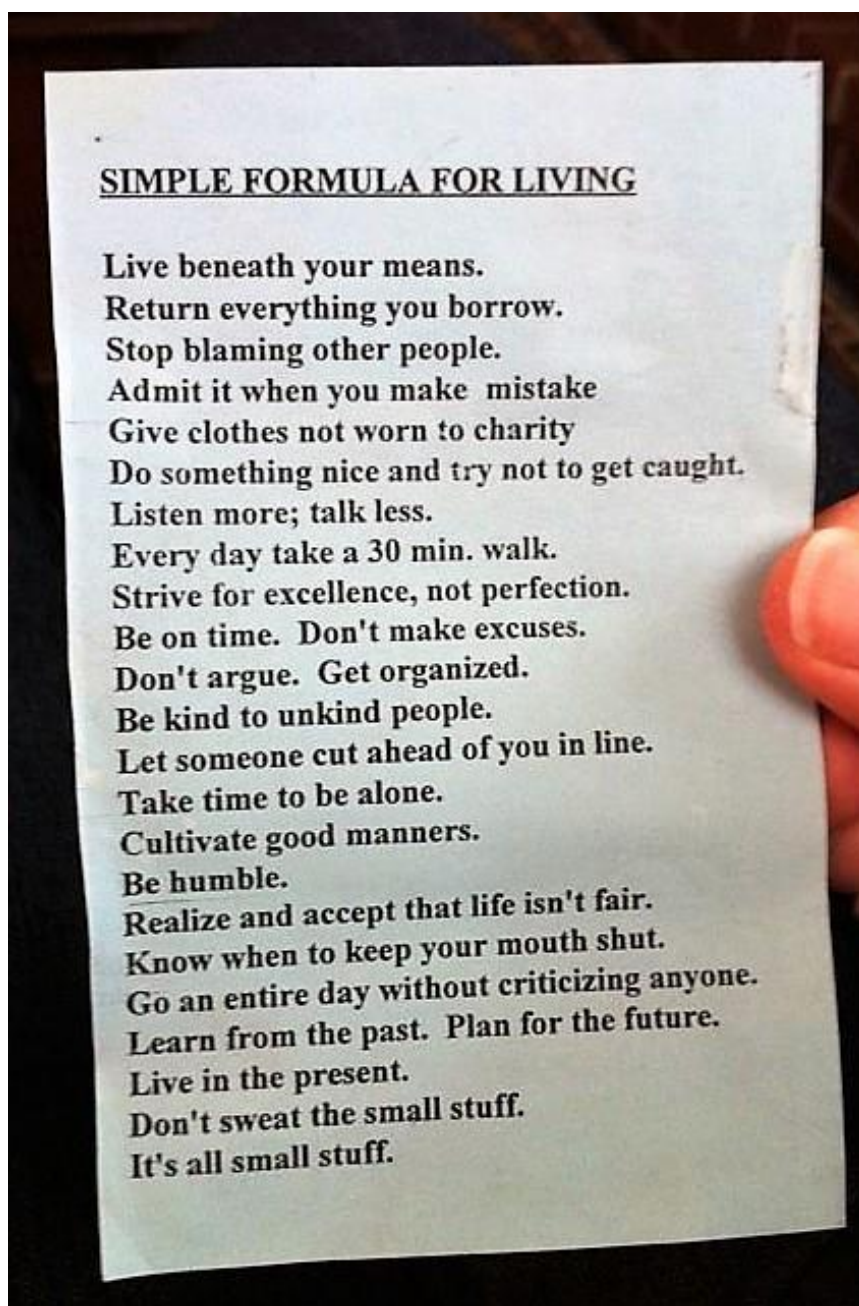
