WOMEN IN THE GREAT WAR (June meeting)

David Humberston gave this talk and began by setting the scene with the battle of Ypres, which changed history and geography.

He talked about the roles of many well-known women, starting with the tragic tale of Edith Cavell, and including stories of numerous titled ladies who set up various charities which aided the war effort at home and abroad.

Marie Curie (the only woman to be awarded two Nobel Prizes) obtained a number of vehicles which were fitted out as mobile X-Ray centres, and with the help of her daughter and various volunteer radiologists drove them to the front line medical posts which enabled surgeons to make better, more accurate diagnoses thereby treating the wounded quicker and more effectively.

Nurses featured heavily including the Red Cross and St John's Ambulance Brigade. He also covered women in the Land Army and women taking over the factory jobs due to a shortage of men as they had gone to fight. He mentioned the Canary Girls, who were women working with TNT which discoloured their skins yellow, hence their nickname.

He spoke about the women Secret Agents and Spies who worked both at home and in France and Belgium many of whom, if discovered, were executed.

This is just a snapshot of a very interesting talk.

Next we need the notorious pack of eight playing cards, all jokers, four red and four black. Our blind choices establish today's two teams, and which team should choose its colours.

Each ball must go through the six hoops on a clockwise route [from God's viewpoint] followed by the same six hoops anticlockwise. So confusing, and hardly time for a quick coffee and one biscuit. Just keep concentrating!

For some of the group it's a long way to come by buses or cars to Great Glen every Thursday morning, for some it's home territory.....but there is one thing in common, **WE ALL LOVE IT!**

The group will resume its regular weekly dancing on Tuesday 10 September, 1.30 to 3.30pm in the Sports Hall. There will be various public dances at local folk dance clubs in the Autumn period, including a Playford (1651 to 1728) Ball at Rushden on October 5th where attendees are invited to wear period costume. With that in mind we shall practice dances from the 17th and 18th centuries so that any members planning to attend the Ball can take to the floor with confidence and in style!

We are always pleased to welcome new members to our weekly meetings for an afternoon of fun and gentle exercise in good company. Most of our dances are conducted at walking pace, with occasionally skipping so are not too vigorous. The dances are performed in specific formations of

circles, squares and longways sets, and they span English Country, English Court (Playford), and American Square and Contra styles. Some dances date back to the Stuart and Georgian/Regency periods, or even earlier, while others were written very recently. The music we use ranges from classical (Handel, Purcell, Mozart, Bach) to modern compositions, sometimes even jazz, and for the older country dances often features tunes that will be very familiar to anybody who enjoys traditional English folk music.

No previous experience is needed as all the dances are fully explained, the moves are walked through before setting them to music and the dances are called throughout. Also, no special clothing needed - just light-weight flat shoes or sandals and comfortable clothing suitable for gentle dancing. Nor do you need to come with a partner; singles of both sexes are welcomed, and we often change partners during the dances so that everybody is involved. The only requirement is to be prepared to join in, laugh and enjoy yourself.

And finally..

St Swithin's Day – 15 July



St. Swithin was a beloved ninth-century bishop (born c. 800—died July 2, 862) of Winchester, England. He served as counsellor to Kings Egbert and Aethelwulf of the West Saxons. On or about October 30, 852, he was consecrated bishop of Winchester. He requested that he be buried in the churchyard – some say to be close to the common people, whom he loved; some say so that he could enjoy God's gift of rain for all eternity. When he died in 862, his request was honoured. But

about 100 years later it was deemed unseemly that so holy a man should rest in a common grave. On July 15, the saint's feast day, the people attempted to enshrine his remains in his church. However, legend has it that St. Swithin caused torrential rains to fall for 40 days, until the intended transfer was abandoned. Folklore now reports that if it rains on St Swithin's Day it will rain for 40 days more! So keep your fingers crossed for sunny weather on 15 July
