The Driving Test *(September meeting)*



Brian Johnson drew upon his extensive experience in the field of driver testing (he retired as a Senior Driving Test Examiner) to provide us with an illuminating and amusing account of the origins and evolution of the driving test. In Britain, unlike France – which was well ahead of us in this regard, driving was very much a laissez-faire business until the early thirties. These saw the introduction of the minimum driving age for cars of 17 and the 30 miles-per-hour speed limit, then the subsequently much to be revised Highway Code. The first to be required to pass a test were public service vehicle drivers. It was in 1934 that Lord Leslie Hore-Belisha introduced the motor driving test that most of us will remember passing. It was decided that the introduction of the

test should be widely publicised, and we were treated to a viewing of the contemporaneous Ministry of Transport film shown in cinemas throughout the land to prepare the public for this important change. Few if any in the audience will have seen this first time round, and it proved the unforgettably hilarious highlight of a most entertaining and well-researched presentation.
